Programme of guided walks

Tuesday

A walk along the lovely coast path joining Paignton & Brixham – an ideal introduction to the English Riviera!

Thursday

Walk up to Haytor one of the most spectacular rock outcrops on Dartmoor – following the granite railway.

Friday

The picturesque coastline at Dartmouth / Little Dartmouth.

Saturday

Day trip to Cornwall: The Atlantic coast, in the footsteps of King Arthur! Tintagel–Boscastle Coast walk, with entrance to Tintagel Castle included.

Tuesday

Dartmoor circular walk – starting from the picturesque village of Widecombe in the Moor.

Thursday

Coleton Fishacre circular coast walk, to include visit to House and gardens at Coleton Fishacre and cream tea.

Friday

A walk along the cliff tops at Maidencombe and Babbacombe.

Saturday

Follow the John Musgrave trail from Paignton to Totnes via Berry Pomeroy Castle – a peaceful walk through woods and pasture.
