

LOCATION

The South Australian College of English (SACE Adelaide) is located in Adelaide, South Australia. The campus is situated in the city centre only a 5 minute walk to the mall, shops, restaurants, cafes, public transport and beautiful parklands.

Adelaide, South Australia

- Adelaide is the capital of South Australia and has a population of 1.1 million people.
- Adelaide is the Gateway to the Great Australian Outback and Uluru (Ayers Rock).

- Adelaide is a safe smaller city which has significantly lower costs of accommodation, transport, food and recreation.



GETTING HERE

Qantas, Jetstar and Virgin Blue offer direct flights from most mainland capital cities. Many direct flights to Adelaide International Airport. The Adelaide Airport is located 20 minutes by car from the city centre.

CLIMATE

The climate in Adelaide is similar to that in the Mediterranean. It is dry and mild with most of the rain fall in the winter months. The average temperature in summer is 30°C and in winter 15°C.

TRANSPORT

Full-time students are issued with a student card which entitles them to a 50% discount receive a discount on the City Bus Service.

WORKING IN ADELAIDE

Many SACE students find part-time work in shops, cafes, restaurants, bars and hotels. Students are also able to find work picking fruit at orchards and vineyards surrounding Adelaide.

Students can get job placement assistance from SACE when enrolling in our English & Work Oz Course which prepares them for entry into the Australian workplace.

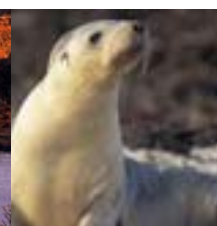

GETTING HERE

Hobart enjoys a mild climate, with four distinct seasons. The average maximum temperature in summer (December to February) is 23°C to 26°C and in winter (June to August) 12°C—15°C.

GETTING HERE

Jetstar and Virgin Blue offer direct flights from all mainland capital cities except Perth and Darwin. Many other flights connect via Sydney, Brisbane or Melbourne. Qantaslink also has a direct flight from Cairns to the Great Barrier Reef Airport on Hamilton Island.

CLIMATE

Average daily temperatures range from 23°C in the winter months from June to July and 30.5°C in January during the height of summer. Average water temperatures remain a welcoming 25°C all year round.

TRANSPORT

Students are issued with a student card which entitles them to receive a discount on the Whitsunday Bus Service. An airport bus transfer service is also available from Proserpine to Airlie Beach which costs approximately AUD\$16.

WORKING IN THE WHITSUNDAYS

Airlie Beach is a busy tourism town which attracts both international and domestic tourists. Students find part-time work in shops, cafes, restaurants, bars, hotels and resorts. Students can also enrol in our English & Work Oz Course which prepares them for entry into the Australian workplace.
