LANGUAGE AND ACTIVITY PROGRAMMES FOR YOUNG LEARNERS

Our Language and Activity Programmes are vacation courses for young people.

Each of the programmes is designed for a specific age group and includes every aspect of your stay with us in England:

1. Transportation from London's Heathrow or Stansted airport on arrival
2. 15 or 21 hours of teaching each week
3. Accommodation in a homestay or student residence
4. All meals
5. Daily activities, sports and local visits
6. One or two full-day excursions each week
7. A high staff-to-student ratio
8. Medical insurance
9. Transportation back to the airport at the end of the programme

Teaching

The academic content of these programmes is just as carefully structured as that of our intensive English courses for older students. The teaching concentrates on speaking and listening and, in this way, builds on the English you may have already studied in your home country.

You will be tested on your first day and placed at the appropriate level, from beginner to advanced. Your classes will be dynamic, interactive, appropriate for your age and effective. You will be in a class of no more than 16 students and will be taught by a team of two teachers.

Lesson topics

Our lessons include a variety of interesting topics for lively discussion in class. These topics keep you interested – and talking English. For 2012 there are at least 16 topics arranged in eight pairs as follows:

1. Adventure/Our environment
2. What's new?/Shopping and fashion
3. Fame/The media
4. Family/Friends
5. Food/Health
6. Olympic sports/Free time
7. Going away/Staying at home
8. Investigation/Fact or fiction



Welfare and Supervision

Your welfare and safety are our primary concern and most important responsibility. Many proven measures are in place to ensure that all participants have a pleasant and trouble-free stay with us in England. These include:

- Careful selection of the schools and colleges where we hold our courses
- The design of activity programmes appropriate for the age of the participants, with good adult supervision
- A high staff-to-student ratio in all our schools, particularly in residential centres
- The careful selection and supervision of our homestay hosts (local families)
- A 24-hour emergency telephone number
- A Welfare Officer at each centre
- A medical insurance policy for all students (at no additional cost)

Studio Cambridge has been a leader in the design and management of programmes for young learners for more than 40 years. This experience gives us the confidence to say that at Studio Cambridge you will be in caring and capable hands.

Accommodation and meals

Accommodation and all meals are included in the course fees. Depending on the programme you choose, accommodation can be:

- with a local family (homestay)
- in a student residence at the course centre (residential on campus)
- in a student residence separate from the course centre (residential)

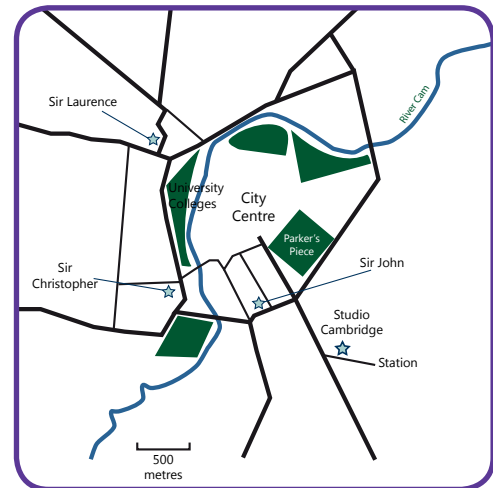
Excursions

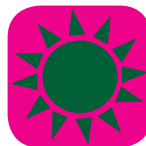

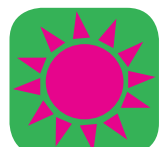

THE TOWN

Ely (pronounced to rhyme with "freely") is a beautiful, peaceful town in the heart of the Cambridgeshire countryside: the ideal setting for children. It is 25 kilometres north of Cambridge and 125 kilometres from London.

Its magnificent cathedral, established in 1083, dominates the city and makes this one of the finest and most unspoilt mediaeval cities in Britain. Many of the mediaeval buildings are part of The King's School's teaching centres and student residences.

The centre of the town has a traditional English 'High Street' with a wide range of shops and a classic market square. Although it is a city, Ely has a population of only 15,000 people and is often described as a 'village': not surprising when everyone you meet soon becomes a friend.

THE SCHOOL

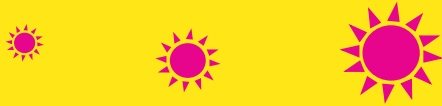
There are few schools in the world that can boast a history like that of The King's School Ely. The school was founded over 1,000 years ago. King Edward the Confessor, who died in 1066, was educated in the magnificent buildings around Ely Cathedral which are still used by the school today.

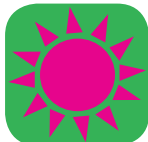

THE TOWN

Dating from the eighth century, the town of Reading (pronounced "Redding") is in the Royal County of Berkshire and situated on the River Thames. It is only 65 kilometres from central London (25 minutes by train), and 45 kilometres from London's Heathrow airport.

Reading is a vibrant and prosperous town and is considered one of Britain's top 10 shopping cities, with several shopping areas including the riverside Oracle Centre.

The city has a popular university and football team, as well as an annual celebrated music festival known simply as 'Reading'. It has also had several famous inhabitants over the centuries, including Jane Austen and Oscar Wilde.

THE SCHOOL

Leighton Park School is situated in 24 hectares of beautiful parkland, just 3 kilometres from the centre of Reading. It is a truly remarkable independent school. The editor of *The Good School Guide* wrote that it was one of the most distinctive schools he had visited, with "integrity and honesty at heart".

The school has a heated indoor swimming pool, a gymnasium, tennis courts and cricket pitches, all on campus. In addition to these excellent sports facilities, Leighton Park School has a large, fully-equipped and up-to-date theatre, and extensive football facilities: the ideal location for students wishing to combine English language study with dance, football or mixed activities.

OPTION ONE - FOOTBALL

Learn English and play football in the land of football. Training is provided, in part, by coaches from Reading Football Club who develop players' skills and emphasise the values of teamwork, fair play and sportsmanship. Individual skills tournaments are held each week, with prizes for the winners. Training is held on afternoons and evenings, using Leighton Park School's football pitches, the gymnasium and classrooms.



You will visit Reading Football Club's Championship league stadium and at least one other excursion will be to a Premier League or national football stadium. All football abilities are welcome.

THE TOWN

Cambridge is one of the most famous, and instantly recognised, city names in the world. It has been a centre of learning for more than 800 years and is the international symbol of academic excellence and achievement.

But is it also fun. With 20,000 university students, virtually the only "business" of Cambridge is education and the whole social and cultural life of the city is designed for young people.

It is the ideal place for the English language student; international in outlook but very English in character; steeped in history but right up to date; big enough to spend weeks exploring without getting bored, small enough to be relaxed and friendly. It is a town of 100,000 people that sometimes feels like a big city and sometimes like a village.

And London is just 100 kilometres away - only 45 minutes by train.



THE SCHOOL

The Sir Michael programme is held at our main school at 6 Salisbury Villas, Cambridge. Studio Cambridge is the oldest language school in Cambridge, established in 1954. This is our main, year-round school and all our senior management and administrative staff are here to help you at all times.

Studio Cambridge is in Victorian buildings more than 100 years old. It is in an excellent location, 10 minutes' walk from Cambridge city centre and 400 metres from the central train station.

THE TOWN

THE UNIVERSITY

LESSONS

Our Sir William Programme gives you a choice of two academic programmes:

- **THE STANDARD PROGRAMME** with 15 hours each week of English lessons

OR

- **THE INTENSIVE PROGRAMME** with 21 hours each week of English lessons. If you choose the intensive programme, the extra hours of English lessons will take the place of some afternoon activities. There is no difference in price between the standard and intensive programmes.

ACTIVITIES

On the standard programme (15 hours of lessons per week), students have activities every afternoon and evening except on excursion days. On the intensive programme (21 hours of lessons per week), students have extra lessons in the afternoons, with activities every evening, except on excursion days.

There will only be one excursion during your last week, to allow for your departure.

ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS

The school offers very comfortable student accommodation. All students attending this programme live on-campus or are accommodated in university residences close to the campus; homestays are not available.

The accommodation includes:

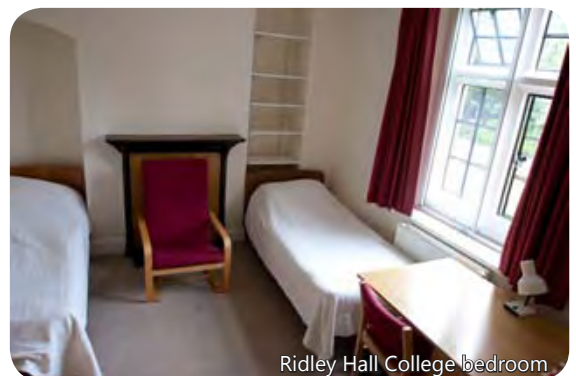

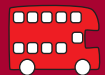

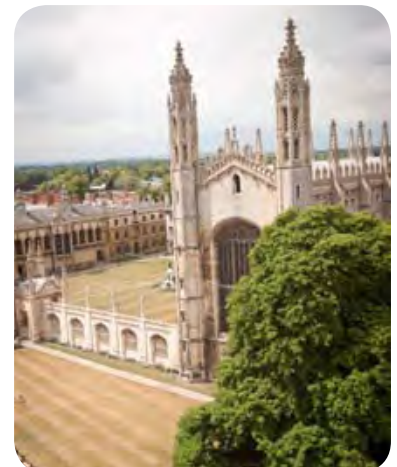

LESSONS

Our Intensive Programme is different from most of our summer programmes. It is more study-oriented, and more intensive - based on a total of 21 hours of English (28 lessons) each week.

Morning lessons:

15 hours of lessons are held in the mornings from Monday to Friday. The content of these lessons differs according to the level of each class. However, all programmes include the intensive study of:

- Grammar
- Speaking skills
- Pronunciation and intonation
- Listening comprehension
- Writing skills
- Reading comprehension

Afternoon sessions

The remaining 6 hours of lessons are held in the afternoons. These sessions involve project work and can include:

- English theatre - study and act in a play
- Guide to Cambridge - research and write a guide to Cambridge for your friends
- Radio show - write and then record your own radio show
- English magazine - plan and write a short story
