

Safety Guidelines Enforex Camps

With the objective of taking maximum care of the language immersion experience of our campers and to provide them with a safe environment on our camps have implemented strict specific safety and hygiene protocols, in addition to adapting our facilities and equipping them with all the necessary means, based on current regulations and the new reality standard, so that our campers have a 100% unique and safe experience, and that they only have to worry about learning and enjoying their stay with us.

Described below you will find the most important points of the safety guide of our camps. The complete protocols can also be downloaded at our web, as well as a quick guide in which we show you everything that our students will be able to do during their stay.

Enforex Camps Safety Guidelines:

- All camps have been completely disinfected before opening.
- All bus transfers will be reduced to 50% of the capacity of the busses, also the number of transfers will be minimized.
- Our entire team including teachers, instructors and camp directors have had extensive briefing in the different measures taken and guidelines implemented. They will be happy to explain them to you at any time.
- At the camp entrance there will be a wet doormat with disinfectant and a dry one that will have to be used by anyone entering or leaving the camp.
- On the first day campers will receive a small training to make their experience 100% safe, and they will find out about all the activities they will be able to do. All campers must comply with health and safety regulations during the programme. Compliance will be checked on a regular basis and disciplinary measures will be taken in case necessary.
- Throughout the entire camp there will be explanatory signs in different languages to maintain the security and inform campers about the protocols.
- Temperatures of campers will be measured 3 times a day.
- During all activities both indoor and outdoor, established groups will have a maximum of 14 participants, always maintaining the personal physical distance required.
- Activity programme will be reviewed and adapted in order to avoid those activities that require more physical contact. (For ex. visits to beach, pool).



- We will follow current regulations for use of face masks, of which the use for the time being is mandatory in enclosed spaces. All campers must bring 2 face masks per day and disinfectant gel.
- Common areas will be adapted according to current regulations:
 - o The dining room will offer sufficient personal space between students.
 - o Swimming pool will have a maximum capacity, based on rules established by (local) government.
 - o All classrooms are prepared so that students can maintain a safe distance at all times.
- The rooms in most of our facilities will be private or double. On those camps where, until now rooms were shared among more students, the capacity of the rooms will be reduced with 50% in order to guarantee the necessary personal space.
- We will intensify the ventilation in all our facilities.
- The entire camp, and more specifically the classrooms, will be deep cleaned with disinfectant products on a regular basis.
- In the unfortunate event of a camper becoming sick we will activate an emergency protocol. All facilities will have a designated quarantine area in case necessary.
- It is recommended that students take a Covid-19 test before travelling to the camp.
