

OFFICIAL COMMUNICATION FROM THE CENTRE INTERNATIONAL ANTIBES

To prepare for the stay parents are asked to:

- Monitor their child's temperature before their departure and not to allow their child to travel if they have a fever higher than 38.0 ° C.
- Provide a box of disposable surgical masks (50 pieces) in their child's suitcase. No cloth masks, as juniors will not be able to wash their mask on-site.
- Provide an individual bottle of hydroalcoholic gel for hands.
- For children under the age of 11, the use of the gel will be monitored by the supervision team.

Reception at the airport or on site:

- For the first day of arrival on June 21st, we advise you to plan for the flight / train / drop-off to be in the afternoon as we have the obligation to stay inside the campus on the first day (no unsupervised going out permission). Beginning of outdoor activities from June 22.
- On arrival during pick-up wearing of the mask is mandatory for students and staff. Students must keep their mask on during transfers to the campus by minibus or by bus.
- Students will be asked to use a hydroalcoholic hand gel which we will provide before getting into the vehicle
- Forehead thermometer to check for temperature upon arrival on campus.
- Upon arrival on site, presentation of the school and our procedures in groups of 15 students maximum.
- If dropped off by parents, parents will not be able to enter campus. In an emergency situation, it will be possible to allow access with a mask.

Sanitary Rules:

- Presentation of distancing measures and health instructions during the welcome meeting. Explanation of the rhythms and duration of hand washing.
- Reminder of the distance instructions in group settings (1-meter minimum and groups of 15 people maximum, supervisors not included).
- Sufficient hand washing zones near reception and areas in which activities take place.
- Presence of a bottle of hydroalcoholic gel at the reception and in the various reception areas
- We will also provide students upon arrival a small bottle of hydroalcoholic gel to make sure they have gel on them when off campus.
- Flyers explaining regulations are posted throughout the site
- Floor markings are installed in front of the reception so as to encourage students to respect the distance of a minimum of one meter and a max. number of 2 students at a time inside the reception.
- If it is impossible to respect the distance of 1 meter, wearing a mask is compulsory for receptive staff and for persons in contact with juniors when they are in the presence of children.
- The wearing of a protective visor is possible in addition to the mask but not on its own.
- The wearing of a mask is not required for minors ages 8-11 except when they show symptoms of COVID-19 infection.
- The wearing of a mask is only compulsory for minors over 11 years old during activities/situations that do not allow to respect physical distances.
- We provide disposable masks to the entire receptive and supervisors team and organize training sessions regarding health measures before the start of each day.

For Classes:

- The classes are organized by group of 15 students maximum in the Antibes ESSENTIAL program and 10 students maximum in our Juan Les Pins PREMIUM program, reduction in number of students present in the classroom if the room does not allow to respect the rule of 1-meter distancing.
- Compulsory hand washing with hydroalcoholic gel under the direction of the teacher.
- The teacher will provide students a bottle of hydroalcoholic gel in each class.
- All teachers arriving on campus must wash their hands when entering the teachers' room and then into their classroom. The teacher will be obliged to wear a mask
- We will avoid placing students in mini-working groups if incompatible with distancing measures (Otherwise it will be mandatory for students to wear masks).
- Hand washing every 30 minutes and every time a student comes back into the classroom after an outing.
- Students will have to bring their own stationary supplies and will not be able to lend them to their classmates.
- Classroom ventilation before students begin class, during breaks and after class.
- Implementation of circulation directives to avoid individuals crossing paths.
- Groups of students in class will be fixed for the week (unless exceptional circumstance in which student changes class).
- The use of a collective fan or spray mist is prohibited.
- The use of air conditioning is possible in the premium program, the classes with air conditioning have been disinfected before the season (filter cleaning).

For Accommodation:

- Accommodation in a room for 2 or 4 people depending on the size of the room in order to comply with health standards (1 meter between each bed), some rooms will become individual rooms if it is impossible to respect this distance
- Room access is possible at certain times, and always in the presence of the supervision team.
- Installation of markings indicating the direction of circulation in hallways
- Access to common sanitary facilities will be regulated and monitored by the supervision team to allow cleaning and disinfection of the premises.
- In order to ensure hygiene measures, any request for a change of room, thereby triggering disinfection of the two rooms during the stay, will be invoiced at € 50.
- The use of a collective fan or spray mist is prohibited.
- Students are encouraged by the supervision team to ventilate their rooms as often as possible outside of the interventions already planned by the management.

For Cleaning:

- Thorough cleaning of the premises will be performed before its opening.
- The maintenance of the premises is carried out using the usual procedures and products, with household gloves. It is however carried out with greater frequency (twice a day).
- Ventilation of the rooms at each cleaning.
- Frequently touched objects (door handles, surfaces, sanitary facilities, floors, if necessary educational or activity materials, etc.) will be disinfected daily with a virucidal disinfectant product (standard NF EN 14476)
- The rooms will be cleaned daily and disinfected at the end of each stay.
- Garbage cans are available on site to collect the masks after use.

For Catering:

- Hand washing should be done before and after each meal.
- Establishment of markings on the ground to respect distancing rules when queuing.
- No buffet service, one individual platter of food for each student.
- Installation of circulation direction to avoid students crossing paths.
- 1-meter distance between the tables and the students.
- Tables and the back of chairs will be disinfected after each meal.
- Allocated meal time to allow the passage of all juniors.

For Activities:

- The organized activities cannot group more than 15 juniors (supervisors not included).
- The groups of students in activity will be fixed by the week in order to limit interactions between the different groups
- The imposed physical distance is two meters for physical activities.
- Collective sports, combat sports, and recreational use of our swimming pools are currently prohibited though this is to be confirmed. Swimming in the sea is authorized.
- Independent free time without the presence of a supervisor is possible by respecting the rule of 4 juniors over the age of 14 maximum per group.
- Wearing a mask is compulsory. The sanitary instructions will be reminded before each free time. **NO free time for those under 14**

For Transport:

- The rules of social distancing apply in transportation (1 meter). Children over the age of 11 must wear a mask when the safety distances cannot be observed inside the vehicle.
- Vehicles are cleaned before and after use during the day and disinfected every evening.
- Wearing of a mask is mandatory for the driver, the supervisors, and the students if it is impossible to respect the 1-meter distance rule.
- The use of public transport is possible according to current regulations

For student's health monitoring:

- A COVID referent will be appointed on each campus to ensure staff training and the application of health guidelines.
- Any symptom indicative of COVID-19 infection in a child observed by the supervision team will lead to his/her isolation and the wearing of a mask.
- In case of doubt about the symptoms of a child, a temperature measurement can be taken by the person responsible for health monitoring within the reception or supervision team.
- As per customary practice each campus has a CIA referred doctor who will be contacted at the slightest alert
- Each campus has a room to allow the isolation of any suspected cases.
- Parents will be contacted in case of symptoms.
- The medical care and quarantine of the minor will be applied immediately should symptoms of COVID be present. The student will be separated from those on campus if high fever is present and supervisors.

For the day of departure:

- A temperature reading will be taken before the student boards the vehicle to the airport when leaving the campus to ensure that the junior can take his/her flight in good health conditions.

Post- departure:

- To ensure traceability, please notify the CIA team immediately should your child be diagnosed with COVID after their return home.
