Visa-regulations for EU-citizens

A - Tourist or visitor

Visa-waiver country citizens may enter the U.S. as tourists for up to *90 days* without applying for a specific visa and may attend a course of less than 18 hours per week.

B - Student visa

Students who enrol in a course of 18 hours per week or more must apply for a student visa. **For visitors who apply for an F1 student visa, the requirements are:**

- Valid Digital Passport
- A Bank statement or a Sponsor Letter demonstrating sufficient funds for the period of study (or stay) in the U.S.
- Immigration Form DS 156, DS157, DS158
- US \$ 100 SEVIS (Student and Exchange Visitor System) Fee (payable on-line to the US Administration - www.us-botschaft.de)
- Enrolment for a minimum of 18 hours per week

Visa-regulations for Non-EU-citizens :

- Valid Digital Biometric Passport
- A Bank statement or a Sponsor Letter demonstrating sufficient funds for the period of study (or stay) in the U.S.
- Immigration Form DS 156, DS157, DS158
- SEVIS Fee
- Enrolment for a minimum of 18 hours per week
